

## 4 types of scholarships

### Four Types of Scholarships:

*STO's call them by different names!*

- 1) Original, Individual, FNB: Financial Need Based
- 2) Switcher, Plus, Overflow
- 3) Corporate/Low income
- 4) Disabled/Displaced or D/D

### Original/Individual Qualifiers:

- ▶ 1) Your student must be enrolled in a private school (K-12).
  - ▶ 2) You will need to apply ANNUALLY to receive a scholarship **(To more than just one STO)**.
  - ▶ 3) Some STO's have income limits
  - ▶ 4) If you don't apply, you won't receive anything!
- Basically, EVERYONE enrolled in a Private school in Arizona is eligible for this one!!**

### Switcher/Plus/Overflow:

- ▶ 1) Have transferred from a public school to a private school in the current year.
- OR-
- ▶ 2) Received a Switcher scholarship last year
- OR-
- ▶ 3) Received a Corporate scholarship last year.

*Note: If you ONLY received an Individual scholarship last year and no prior Corporate or Switcher scholarship, you will NOT qualify for a Switcher scholarship this year.*

*Also, if you did not attend an Arizona school last year you will not qualify for a Switcher this year.*

### Corporate Scholarship:

- ▶ 1) Income **MUST** be below the income cap, (typically 185%-342.5% of the Free/Reduced Lunch Federal Guideline) Check each STO for #'s
- AND-
- ▶ 2) You must have received at least one tax-credit scholarship (Individual, Switcher, Corporate, or D/D) in the prior year, -OR-
- ▶ 3) You transferred from an **Arizona** Public School in the past school year

### 185 % of Federal Reduced Price Meals Guideline

### Disabled/Displaced Scholarship (aka: D/D):

- ▶ 1) Your student has an IEP, an MET, or a 504 plan
- OR-
- ▶ 2) Your student has gone through the Arizona foster system at any point in their life. (case # required)
- ▶ 3) There is no income cap, but you must report your income to the STO.

*(Students can potentially receive nearly half their tuition by this scholarship category alone!)*
